



Mike Moseley – Biography

Born November 4, 1946 in Clarksville, TN and raised in Russellville, KY. I graduated from Russellville High School and attended Austin Peay University in Clarksville, TN until TVA “made me an offer I couldn’t refuse”. I dropped out of college to begin my journey with the TVA.

I began my TVA career as a Student Generating Plant Operator on January 11, 1967 at the Widows Creek Fossil Plant in Jackson County, AL. I continued training at the Kingston Fossil Plant, near Kingston, TN, and New Johnsonville Fossil Plant, near New Johnsonville, TN. I transferred to the Cumberland Fossil Plant, in Cumberland City, TN, on May 1, 1971 as an Assistant Unit Operator and remained at that duty station until May 1982. During this period, I served as Assistant Unit Operator, Unit Operator, Assistant Shift Engineer, Shift Engineer and the Training Representative for the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW).

The next phase of my career began in 1982 at the Paradise Fossil Plant, near Drakesboro, KY, as the Assistant Operations Department Manager. In May 1984, I assumed the position of Plant Operations Manager with responsibilities for the three generating units and two Flue Gas Desulphurization Systems. The TVA embarked on its Quality/Process Improvement program in 1992. I accepted a temporary assignment in the TVA Chattanooga Central Office Complex as Quality Manager for Fossil Operations. Our accountabilities included the development and implementation of all key work methods/process, Business Planning Processes, Analysis and Replication Processes and associated tasks for the 11 Fossil Plants and 6,000 +/- employees.

In 1997, the TVA adopted the Production Process and Multi-Skilled employee approach. As Unit Production Manager and team leader for Unit Production Methods and Processes, our accountabilities included development, training and implementation of all key processes associated with the new organization.

I accepted the position of Plant Manager at the Johnsonville Fossil Plant in 1999 and retired in 2002 completing my 35-year career with the TVA.

In 2002, I began a series of coaching/consulting projects including assignments across the USA, Japan and Indonesia. In 2004, I had a tenure in Iraq assigned to the Department of Defense and Department of State. I reported to US Ambassador John Negroponte and served as the Senior Advisor to the Iraq Minister of Electricity. I re-retired in 2015, but “never say never to the right opportunities” assisting power plant managers and leadership teams become more efficient and effective. I prefer to use the term coach versus consult.

I am married with four adult children and six grand-children. We live in Bowling Green, KY and my hobbies include family, friends, motorcycle touring, and cruising on nearby lakes aboard our

boat, "The 401k". I remain active in my neighborhood and the City of Bowling Green, serving on various boards. I am also a veteran of the Tennessee and Kentucky Army National Guard.
