Dear Representative Guthrie:

On behalf of the more than 2 million retirees and future retirees represented by the National Retiree Legislative Network (NRLN), I am requesting that you support calling for a vote in the Subcommittee on Health on **H.R.2903**, **CONNECT for Health Act of 2021**.

H.R.2903 would expand coverage of telehealth services under Medicare. Provisions in the bill are:
allows the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to waive certain restrictions, such as restrictions on the types of technology that may be used;

• permanently removes geographic restrictions on originating sites (i.e., the location of the beneficiary) and allows the home of the beneficiary to serve as the originating site for all services;

• permanently allows federally qualified health centers and rural health clinics to serve as the distant site (i.e., the location of the health care practitioner), and

• allows the CMS to generally waive coverage restrictions during any public health emergency.

Additionally, CMS must report on the effects of expanded telehealth services during the COVID-19 public health emergency, including with respect to the utilization, quality, and outcomes of services. CMS Innovations may also test alternative payment models relating to expanded telehealth.
