Dear Senator Crapo:

On behalf of the more than 2 million retirees and future retirees represented by the National Retiree Legislative Network (NRLN), I am requesting that you support calling for votes in the Committee on Finance on **S.1399, Homecare for Seniors Act** and **S.1512, CONNECT for Health Act of 2021**.

S.1399 would make it easier for older Americans to age in place. It changes the law to allow older adults to use funds from their Health Savings Accounts (HSAs) for homecare. Under this legislation, older adults would be able to use these accounts which they've put their own money into, to pay for qualified homecare services.

S.1512 would expand coverage of telehealth services under Medicare. Among provisions in the bill are:

- allows the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to waive certain restrictions, such as restrictions on the types of technology that may be used;
- permanently removes geographic restrictions on originating sites (i.e., the location of the beneficiary) and allows the home of the beneficiary to serve as the originating site for all services;
- permanently allows federally qualified health centers and rural health clinics to serve as the distant site (i.e., the location of the health care practitioner), and
- allows the CMS to generally waive coverage restrictions during any public health emergency.

Additionally, CMS must report on the effects of expanded telehealth services during the COVID-19 public health emergency, including with respect to the utilization, quality, and outcomes of services. CMS Innovations may also test alternative payment models relating to expanded telehealth.
